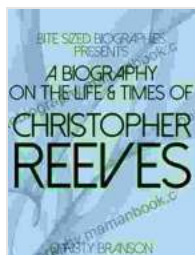


Biography On The Life Times Of Christopher Reeves: Bite Sized Biographies

Personal Life

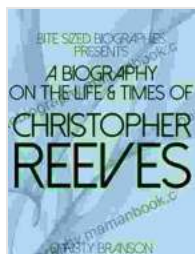

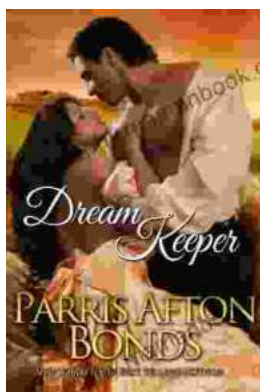

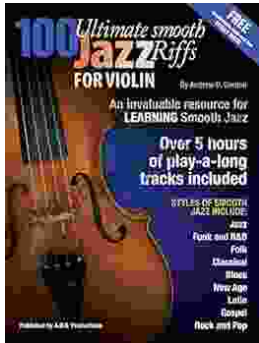
