"Emily," he whispered, his eyes filled with love and longing, "will you marry me?"

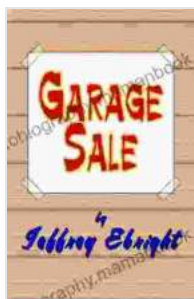
Tears of joy streamed down Emily's face as she nodded yes. And at that moment, in the golden light of the setting sun, two lonely hearts found their forever home in each other.

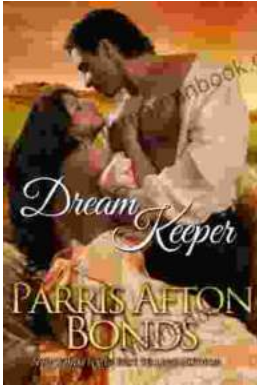

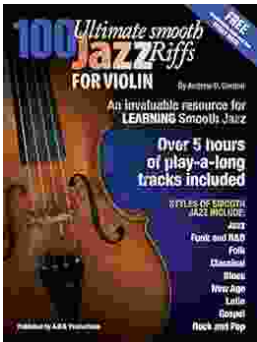
