


One of the things that makes Justice League of America #135 so special is the way it handles the theme of animal rights. The issue shows that


animals are capable of great intelligence and compassion, and that they deserve to be treated with respect. The issue also shows that the Justice League is committed to protecting all life, even the animals.


Justice League of America Vol. 1 #135 (October 1976) wraparound cover art by Dick Dillin and Joe Giella




